- > What promise did the angel give to Hagar (v.10)?
- > Describe the characteristics of Hagar's unborn child (v.11-12)

For Discussion

- Why did God wait so long to give Abraham & Sarah a son?
- How do we sometimes second-guess God, as Sarah did? Why do we do this?
- "God's delays are not His denials." Why is this often a hard truth for us to believe?

Genesis 16:1-12 (NIVUK)

Hagar and Ishmael

¹ Now Sarai, Abram's wife, had borne him no children. But she had an Egyptian maidservant named Hagar; ² so she said to Abram, "The Lord has kept me from having children. Go, sleep with my maidservant; perhaps I can build a family through her."

Abram agreed to what Sarai said. ³ So after Abram had been living in Canaan ten years, Sarai his wife took her Egyptian maidservant Hagar and gave her to her husband to be his wife. ⁴ He slept with Hagar, and she conceived.

When she knew she was pregnant, she began to despise her mistress. ⁵ Then Sarai said to Abram, "You are responsible for the wrong I am suffering. I put my servant in your arms, and now that she knows she is pregnant, she despises me. May the Lord judge between you and me."

- ⁶ "Your servant is in your hands," Abram said. "Do with her whatever you think best." Then Sarai ill-treated Hagar; so she fled from her.
- ⁷ The angel of the Lord found Hagar near a spring in the desert; it was the spring that is beside the road to Shur. ⁸ And he said, "Hagar, servant of Sarai, where have you come from, and where are you going?"
- "I'm running away from my mistress Sarai," she answered.
- ⁹ Then the angel of the Lord told her, "Go back to your mistress and submit to her." ¹⁰ The angel added, "I will so increase your descendants that they will be too numerous to count."
- 11 The angel of the Lord also said to her:
- "You are now with child and you will have a son.
 You shall name him Ishmael,

for the Lord has heard of your misery.

¹² He will be a wild donkey of a man; his hand will be against everyone and everyone's hand against him, and he will live in hostility

towards all his brothers."
