Small Group Questions

John 1:1-5; 8:12

For Starting

- What is one thing that you have done that you would love to have the opportunity to do again?
- How would you spend your 100th birthday?
- Have you ever been afraid of the dark? What happened?
- How would you explain colours to a blind person? How would you explain "eternity" to someone else?

For Reviewing

- ➤ Re-read v.1, replacing "the Word" with "Jesus". What does this tell you about who Jesus is? See also Psalm 119:105.
- ➤ Who "was with God in the beginning" (v.2)? See Isaiah 44:6.
- Compare v.3 with Colossians 1:15-17. What does this tell you about Jesus' timelessness?
- ➤ What was "in him" [Jesus] (v.4)? Why is this so special?
- ➤ What does light do to the darkness (v.5)?
- ➤ Who "will never walk in darkness" (v.12)?

For Discussion

- ➤ John 1:4-5 uses THREE significant motifs/themes: life, light and darkness. Read Genesis 1 and note how often these themes appear. How does this present Jesus as the new Creation?
- In what ways does Jesus fulfill Old Testament promises of the coming of the "light" of salvation? See Exodus 25:37, Leviticus 24:2, Psalm 27:1, Isaiah 9:2, Exodus 13:21.
- > "The fundamental principle of Christianity is to be what God is, and he is light." Do you agree/disagree? Why or why not?
- What do we need to do to make sure Jesus' light continues to shine into our heart and puts out the darkness?
- ➤ How can we explain Jesus' statement of being "The Light of the World" to our non-Christian friends? How can Jesus help us to be a light in the darkness?
- > You could end by reading together John 8:12.
