- > What is God's desire for everyone (v.4)?
- > How is Jesus described in v.5? What does this mean for us today?
- > According to v.6, what did Jesus do? Why is this important?
- > What was the Apostle Paul's task (v.7)?
- > How are men encouraged to pray (v.8)? Is this relevant today?

For Discussion

- Identify some of the prayer postures in the Bible. See 1 Kings 8:22; Dan 6:10; Luke 18:11; 2 Sam 7:18; Gen 24:26; John 17:1; Gen 17:3.
- Of the kind of prayers that Paul mentioned, do we tend to focus on any one type of prayer than others? Why?
- > What responsibility do each of us have in our church as prayers?
- How do relationship problems within a church affect the power and effectiveness of the church's prayer life?
- "If we spent more time preparing to pray and getting our hearts right before God, our prayers would be more effective". Do you agree/disagree? Why/why not? How does this impact our prayer lives today?
- If we were to only pray for ourselves, how would this impact our outreach to the world?
- > You could end by reading together 1 Timothy2:8.
