For Starting

- Share about a time when you trusted someone, only to find out later that you had been deceived.
- Think of the many identities that you have (descriptions that people would say you are). Who do people say you are?
- Look at the "word cloud" (turn over). What title/s catch your attention? Explain why.
- > What do people say today about who Jesus is?

For Reviewing

- > Where were Jesus and His disciples at this time (v.27a)?
- > Whose opinion did Jesus want to know about (v.27b)?
- What THREE people was Jesus compared to (v.28)?
- > How is Jesus' second question different from the first (v.29a)?
- > Who answers the question (v.29b)? What does he say?
- Why does Jesus not want the disciples to share this knowledge (v.30)? See John 2:1-4.

For Discussion

- Peter declares Jesus "the Christ", i.e. "the Messiah". Where else in Mark is this declared? See Mark 1:1; 14:61-62; 15:39.
- Do you think that God makes it difficult for us to believe in Him? What are the biggest obstacles to faith in Jesus?
- Is it enough that we have a high opinion for Jesus? Why or why not? How did you view Jesus when you were younger? Has your view of Jesus changed? If so, how?
- > How would a non-Christian answer the question about Jesus?
- > Why is the character of Jesus such a controversial issue?
- When people ask you about who Jesus is to you, how do you describe Him? What words do you typically use?
- > You could end by reading together Mark 8:29.

Mark 8:27-30 (NIVUK)

Peter declares that Jesus is the Messiah

²⁷ Jesus and his disciples went on to the villages around Caesarea Philippi. On the way he asked them, "Who do people say I am?"

²⁸ They replied, "Some say John the Baptist; others say Elijah; and still others, one of the prophets."

²⁹ "But what about you?" he asked. "Who do you say I am?"

Peter answered, "You are the Christ."

³⁰ Jesus warned them not to tell anyone about him.
